




Mouse was looking for a new house.

That night, Mouse's dreams were bouncy and muddy.




“You can come and sleep with me,” said Parrot.

“Thank you,” said Mouse.




That night, Mouse's dreams were

cold and wet.




Mouse needed somewhere warm and dry.






