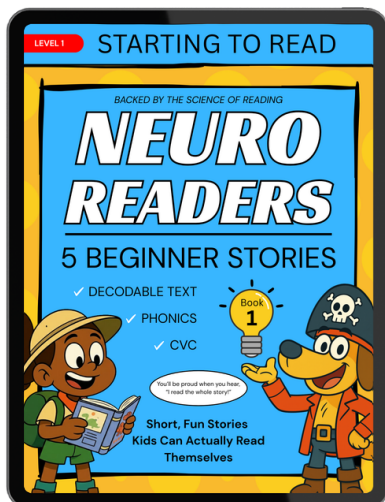

Vocabulary Words: glasses, mopes.

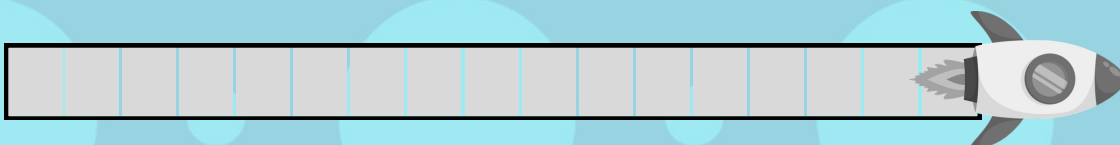
Jane is a princess with red glasses.

glasses.

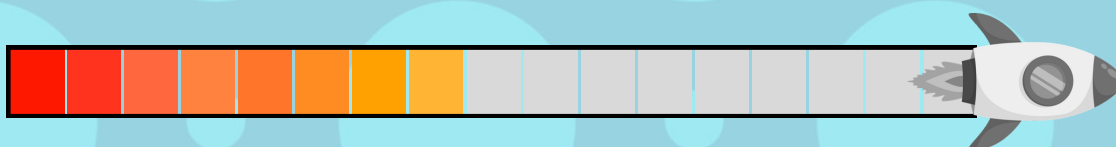
She has dresses for all of her

classes,” said Jane.



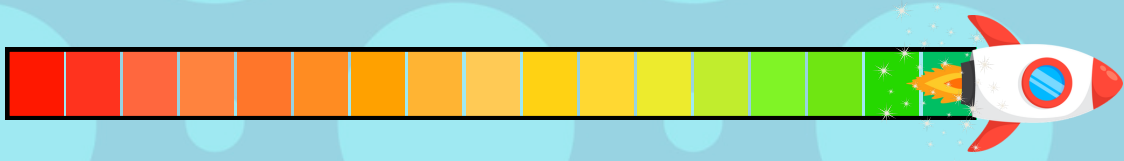


Then Kate walks down the path.
